Earthquake in Pidie Jaya, Nanggroe Aceh Darussalam Province, Indonesia
December 12, 2016

Background

A 6.4 M earthquake shook the districts of Pidie Jaya, Aceh Province, Indonesia at 05:03 on Wednesday (7/12) with a shallow depth of 10 km. No tsunami warning was issued. The epicenter was located in the northeast district of Pidie, at 5.25 N and 96.24 BT or about 106 km south east of Banda Aceh. The earthquake was felt strongly in Pidie, Pidie Jaya and the surrounding districts. Based on the National Statistics Bureau (BP), the total population in Pidie District is around 425,974 while in Pidie Jaya District, it is 151,472. The Provincial Government of Nanggroe Aceh Darussalam declared the disaster as a provincial disaster so no need international support to respond to the emergency situation. It was stated by Sutopo Purwo Nugroho (Head of data and information center and Public Relation of BNPB) that disaster scale is provincial scale so it is not national disaster (MetroNews, 7/12/2016).

At least 101 people were killed (2 districts of Bireuen district, 3 in Pidie district, 96 in the district of Pidie Jaya), including young children, and 136 seriously injured, according to Indonesia's Disaster Management and Mitigation Agency of Banda Aceh (BPBA).

According to the data released by BMKG, from December 10, at 21.00 until December 11, 2016 at 21.00 pm, there were 7 aftershocks, with magnitude of 3 to 5 M. As per December 11, the number of displaced people increased from 43,613 of the previous day to 65,064 (Media Center BNPB - December 11 at 12.00). The electricity in the affected areas has not been functioning well. Due to aftershocks and the electricity problem, the affected people still prefer to spend their night in shelters closest to their home.

Minister of Social Affairs, Mrs. Kofifah Indar Parawansa visited to the Vice Regent of Pidie Jaya on December 10, 2016. During her visit, the minister expressed her concern on data fluctuation of the affected people. Mrs. Kofifah also urged the Public Electricity Company to immediately repair the electricity instalation in the affected area so that the affected people can back to their home. The Indonesia Red Cross will reduce distribution of 40,000 liters clean water to the shelters, because they misused the water for bathing and washing instead of use it for immediate needs of drinking and cooking. The Indonesian Red Cross will review water distribution to be more appropriate.

BPBA declared an emergency response up to 14 days after the earthquake. Report on damage and loss will be provided by BPBA before December 29, 2016.

Common shelters for evacuation used by the affected people are Mosques and Mushola (small mosque), dispersed in 94 villages of 8 sub-districts. General condition of the shelters are still lack of electricity, emergency toilet, space for breastfeeding mothers, friendly children environment.

Immediate Needs

Based on need assessment done by Caritas-PSE Medan and KARINA from 8 to 10 December, 2016, 5 villages of 2 sub-district, namely Trienggadeng and Bandar Baru, the affected residents have not been carrying out their normal activities. The local market has not been working yet, children have not been going to school because their schools are damaged, and the children are still traumatized. The urgent need of the affected residents are:

*) Based on evaluation coordination of BPBA, medical personnel and drugs are still available.

AHA Center has loaded 30 ton of food items. 4 National Clusters (Education, Shelter, Health, Logistic) have been actively coordinating distribution of the immediate needs. The warehouse logistics can be accessed with certain mechanism.

KARINA & CPSE K.A. Medan Response

KARINA and Caritas-PSE Archdiocese of Medan deployed 4 emergency staffs on 8th December evening to joint need assessment with the ER networks previously built by Cordaid and CRS. In doing need assessment, KARINA and Caritas-PSE Medan has been closely coordinating with other agencies such as BPBA, Humanitarian Forum Indonesia/HFI, ECB Consortium and other stakeholders on the ground. Finding of the need assessment was distributed to HFI, ECB Consortium and Caritas Partners present in Indonesia (CRS, DCV, Caritas Australia, Caritas Italiana). KARINA and Caritas-PSE Medan is doing analysis of the finding to provide further recommendation.
